MONITORING & EVALUATION SYSTEM: OBJECTIVES

Two main goals:

- I. Regular assessment of the efficacy of the Climate Box program and results that are achieved in relation to the set goals, objectives and expected outcomes (including enhancing the course of action for program implementation)
- 2. Evaluate positive impact of the program on climate change in terms of reducing carbon footprint or vulnerability to climate change at the household, school or community level


Target 2:

3. Organization of the information collection process and frequency



PROPOSED INFORMATION COLLECTION PROCESS

Children

- Pass tests, surveys to verify received information and knowledge
- Receive feedback from local people benefiting from youth projects
 They include calculations of its effect on the climate in their project

Teachers

- Prepare tests and surveys for children
- Help children with projects and projects' benefits calculations
 Provide a summary report to the UNDP Program Manager in the country

UNDP Country Office

- A UNDP employee (or an external program manager in the country) checks the received information, requests additional data, if necessary
- Sends a summary report from the country to the UNDP regional office

Once in a quarter/trimester

UNDP Regional Office

- Defines a single reporting format for countries
 Checks information received from countries
- Prepares a summary report donors and external communication

As and when needed by the teacher

Minimum once a quarter / trimester

Once in a quarter/trimester
